Lent: How Blessed Are We?

It has been a month since Matthew 5:2-12 was read as part of the lectionary. But for some reason, the Beatitudes have been living in my spiritual atmosphere ever since. As we entered Lent at the end of February, I felt called to delve into the connection between the teachings and the season.

My default view of Lent is heavily influenced by the events that mark its beginning and end. Jesus' trials in the wilderness and the dramatic path to Calvary have always forced me to consider how I would cope if I had to endure anything like either circumstance. I cannot imagine how I would do when faced with sacrificial deprivation, sorrow, pain and death.

Like most other very familiar passages, I have heard the Beatitudes so often that it is difficult to really *hear* them. Beatitude means "supreme, utmost bliss and happiness", something we don't expect until Easter morning. But I am more and more sure that doing all we can to be among the "blessed" will guide us into a more fulfilling Lenten journey, the journey of following Jesus' call to discipleship.

"Blessed" is one of those words (along with its sibling "blessings") that have lost its flavor through overuse. At least one translation uses "happy" in its place, but that seems rather lightweight to me. "Happy" is a comfortable jacket that keeps me warm enough in the spring and shelters me from light rain but is easily stained and torn as we travel through life's challenges. It is barely three dimensional. "Supreme, utmost bliss", on the other hand, is an enveloping sphere whose edges can't be seen most of the time. It is like spending time at Chautauqua. You are surrounded by a near infinite variety of wonderfulness: from symphonies to sparrows, from the lake to limitless challenging and soothing interactions. Just consider being blessed in that way, only more so! It is orders of magnitude beyond my definition of "happy". We need the supreme bliss that Jesus promises. It is essential to the balanced spiritual diet that we all require to be his sisters and brothers. Bliss takes away fear's power, removing all obstacles that attempt to prevent us from

living God's way.

So, let us contemplate these holy teachings. Let us take them deeply into our entire being – body, mind, spirit – so that we might more fully be God's children, Jesus' siblings. And, then move out from our comfort-focus and do that which God created us to do. This hurting world needs us to be the channel of God's healing grace so we all may be whole and free.

I invite you to read Matthew 5:2-12 from your favorite Bible (or Bibles) and then meditate on the version below.

Blessed are...

And Jesus taught them, saying:

Blessed are those who lack arrogance and pride and are not ashamed of their dependence on God. Their heavenly future is assured.

Blessed are those who grieve that creation resists surrendering completely to God's plan. God holds them tenderly and promises that all will be well.

Blessed are those who relate to all with gentleness and humility. In God's realm, they will lack nothing.

Blessed are those who ache for God's values to be creation's only nourishment. They will be fully satisfied. Blessed are those who are unconditionally compassionate. God's compassion is their eternal gift.

Blessed are those whose hearts love only God. They will see God.

Blessed are those who have dedicated themselves to reconciliation. They are God's heirs, and my siblings.

Blessed are those who suffer because of their commitment to God's will. They know that heaven is theirs.

Blessed are you when you suffer for doing God's work in my name. Celebrate, for God's approval outweighs the whole world's denunciation—as the prophets who have preceded you will testify.

Let us open ourselves to the gift of supreme, utmost bliss (which has always been available) – throughout Lent and all of our days.



Western Area Treasurer's Report

Each year, the Area receives interest income from our Endowment Fund. This income is crucially important in funding the ministries of the Western Area. 30% of the income is made available for use by the Department of Community Ministry to provide grant money to local ministry initiatives. 30% supports the outdoor ministry of Dunkirk Camp and Conference Center and 30% funds the work of Plymouth Crossroads as they provide a stable home for boys who might otherwise be on the streets. 2.5% of the Endowment was disbursed to the United Church Home Society to help fund their Senior Wishes program. This year, 7.5% was set aside for use to close an anticipated operating budget deficit for 2020.

The main source of income for the day-to-day ministry of the Western Area is derived from the Covenantal Shares paid by our member churches. Because expenses come throughout the year, we especially appreciate those churches that either spread out their Covenantal Share giving throughout the year or who pay their entire share early in the year. As of February 13, the following churches have already paid 100 percent of their 2020 Covenantal Share: Grace UCC, St. John's in Eden and St. Johns in Strykersville. The following churches have paid part of their 2020 Covenantal Share: Arcade UCC Congregational; Ebenezer UCC; Lockport UCC; and St. Paul's UCC (Shawnee).

In addition to the Covenantal Shares, the New York Conference is requesting all congregations pay \$2 per member (based on numbers reported in the 2019 Yearbook). These Per Capita payments are payable to the Western Area, which then sends the entire amount to the New York Conference. As of February 13, the following churches have already paid their 2020 Per Capita in full: Arcade UCC Congregational; Grace UCC; Lockport UCC; and St. John's UCC (Eden). Ebenezer UCC has paid part of its 2020 Per Capita.

ENDOWMENT REPORT

As noted in the last issue of *In the Vineyard*, the total value of the Endowment on September 30, 2019 was \$434,655.32 (\$27,395.63 in the American Funds, \$44,229.68 in the United Church Funds General, and \$363,030.01 in the United Church Funds Endowment). As of December 31, the total value had increased to \$459,577.49 (\$29,302.95 in the American Funds, \$45,411.33 in the United Church Funds General, and \$384,863.21 in the United Church Funds Endowment).

The September 30 total value is used every year to determine the amount to be withdrawn and disbursed the following January. The January 2020 withdrawal of \$21,790 was taken from the United Church Funds General Account and transferred to the Western Area's checking account. Please refer to Rev. Morgan's treasurer's report to see how that amount was disbursed in late January.



Peace Light

The Peace Light is a flame that originates at the Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem, Palestine. Each year, a child from Upper Austria fetches the Light from the Grotto where Jesus was born. The Light is carried in two blast proof miners' lamps on an Austrian Airlines jet from Tel Aviv, Israel to Vienna, Austria. From there, it is distributed at a Service of Dedication to delegations from across Europe, who take it back with a message of Peace to their own countries. Austrian Airlines then flies the miners' lamps containing the Peace Light from Bethlehem to New York City, where it is received and distributed to communities across the nation with the same message of Peace. On Tuesday, December 17, Kenilworth UCC received the Peace Light.

As the Peace Light is a symbolic moment, extinguishing it does not diminish its message; think of the candle as infused with the Spirit of Peace. The goal is to infuse as much Spirit of Peace as possible, so Kenilworth would like to share this with all the other churches of the Western Area. 


