Lent: The Slippery Season

For me, Lent is the slipperiest liturgical season. Having grown up in the 1960s in a Disciples of Christ family, my earliest experiences of Lent were fragments and misconceptions gleaned from my neighbors and classmates who were Roman Catholic. Forehead ashes on Ash Wednesday and eating fish instead of meat were the most obvious signs. Anyone I might have asked wouldn't really know the whole story on why "those people" did these seemingly odd things, so there was a fog of mystery along with the them/us divide to make all this more impenetrable.

As time passed – ooh, the 70s! – the curtain parted bit-by-bit, and some understanding peeked through the fog, but it was strictly cerebral. It took even longer – the 80s! – to begin to learn that cerebral approaches to faith/spiritual matters were surface scratchers for the most part. So, Lent remained as easy for me to grasp as mercury from a broken thermometer (do you remember non-digital thermometers?).

I do not recall when we started to read the scriptures as laid out in the Revised Common Lectionary but doing that at least made the structure of the church year more obvious. But Lent's readings (Year C) have no obvious linear/historic progression until we arrive at the end: Palm Sunday, which flows into Holy Week and Eastertide.

It wasn't until a group of CC(DC) and UCC lay and clergy women adopted me (bless them for trusting this very traditional know-it-all man who led with his head and pretty much ignored his spirit and body) and showed me how to move toward the whole being God created me to be.

They guided me as I hesitatingly took the first steps into the infinite cosmos of spirituality that touches on what lies beyond our self-limited ways of being children of God. I trusted them as I revealed my vulnerability and discovered gentle strength that made my fortress of rigidity dissolve into nothingness. We took seriously the commandment to love God with our entire selves.

I learned that letting go was more efficient than grabbing/holding on, because the life that God gives us really is a journey (that is only a cliché if you just say it instead of truly living it). What is vital to me or you at this moment may be dust in the next. We may be able to discern the next step in the journey – and the general direction may have varying degrees of clarity – but the steps after that are only alive in the Source Of All Gifts. We will be blessed with them in the fullness of time.

So, I am reminding myself as I write this that it is best that Lent seems slippery! I am aware that I have a very long way to go. We must join Jesus in the wilderness, not knowing what will happen next or how we will survive and learn with all of our being how to endure on/with Faith alone.

Let us love alike, even though we don't believe alike. Love God with our entire being and love one another as Jesus loves us. Abandon selfishness and fear in our entire lives. Do and be so that barriers to the full potential of others (as well as ourselves) are removed. Let us lay ourselves entirely open so that God's full intention for Creation blossoms in each one of us.

We are the Body of Christ, united – through *all* ways we can experience life – in faith. Lent is the perfect season to embark on the next step of our journey together.

Treasurer's Report

The main source of income for the Western Area is derived from the Covenantal Shares paid by our member churches. We have bills to pay every month of the year, so we especially appreciate those churches that don't wait until December to make a payment. As of February 19, the following churches have already paid 100 percent of their 2019 Covenantal Share: First Congregational (Jamestown); Kenmore UCC; Phoenix UCC; Pilgrim Memorial UCC; St. Peter's UCC (North Tonawanda); and St. Stephen's UCC. The following churches have paid part of their 2019 Covenantal Share: Arcade UCC; Ebenezer UCC; Lockport UCC; and St. Paul's UCC (Shawnee).

In addition to the Covenantal Shares, our United Church of Christ congregations are being asked to pay a new Per Capita, which is \$2.00 per member, as reported in the 2018 Yearbook. Per Capita payments are payable to the Western Area, which then sends the entire amount to the New York Conference. As of February 19, the following churches have already paid their 2019 Per Capita in full: Arcade UCC; First Congregational (Jamestown); Kenmore UCC; Phoenix UCC; Pilgrim Memorial; St. John's UCC (Eden); and St. Stephen's UCC.





First, our pastor retired, so we will be having supply pastors until we can secure an interim. Each pastor preaches with different styles and personality. CHURCH WORLD SERVICE KITS

Once again, Amherst Community Church, 77 Washington Hwy, Buffalo (716-834-9700) will be the drop off location for Kits for Church World Service in Western New York. Drop off dates are 4/8/2019 from 9:00-5:00 and 4/9/2019 from 9:00 to 12:00. If necessary, you can arrange other times by calling me directly at 716-622-7482 (Shirley Lam). According to the CWS Kits

website, Zion UCC will also be collecting kits.

There are several different types of kits your group or you may wish to donate:

- Hygiene kits
- School kits
- Emergency clean-up buckets

In the face of natural disasters, violence, or grinding poverty, Hygiene Kits can mean the difference between sickness and health for struggling families.

To assemble a Hygiene Kit you will need:

- One hand towel measuring approximately 16" x 28" (no fingertip, bath, or dish towels or microfiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb removed from the package
- One nail clipper removed from the package
- One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- Ten standard size Band-Aids®

Place all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure, remove excess air from bag, and seal. Please do not add toothpaste to the Hygiene Kit. Cartons of toothpaste that have an extended expiration date will be added to Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment by Church World Service.

For the School and Emergency Cleanup Buckets kits, you can go to the Church World Service website at: cwskits.org

Packing and Shipping Kits

- Pack CWS Kits in boxes with only one type of Kit in each box.
- Clearly indicate the type and numbers of Kits on the outside of the box.
- Secure the boxes with packing tape.
- Either use the forms provided on the website or at the depot or provide a return address on the box.

Funds for Processing/Shipping and Purchasing Kits

Funds are needed to cover sorting, packing, and insurance, as well as shipping Kits to their final destination. Please give \$2 for each Hygiene Kit and school kit you send and \$3 for each Emergency Cleanup Buckets. You will be given a coupon and envelope when you drop off your kits to mail in the processing fees. The processing fees do not go into the boxes or kits.

<u>Cash donations</u> in lieu of assembled Kits also help Church World Service provide much-needed supplies. You can mail checks to CWS, P.O. Box 968, Elkhart, IN 46515.

Updates from the Commission on Ministry, New York Conference Rev. Dr. Ann M. Van Cleef, Chair February, 2019

Please tell all your church women (even if you do not have a Women's Fellowship Group) about the **UCCNY Women's Retreat,** Thursday – Saturday, May 2-4, at the Watson Homestead in Painted Post, NY. Forms may be downloaded from a link on the NY Conference website starting in March.

The Conference has a wonderful program called "UCC 101." It's a series of 45-minute Internet classes given by Conference Staff on Thursday nights at 7:00 p.m. The classes are very interesting, and worthy of Continuing Education credit for clergy. Check the NY Conference website for the ZOOM link. If that's too much technology, you may also participate via telephone.

The **2019** Consultation for Committees on Ministry will take place Tuesday – Wednesday, June 4-5, noon to noon, at the Ramada Inn, 6555 Old Collamer Road, East Syracuse, NY, 13057. This is not a retreat, rather, it is a training session for

Association Committees on Ministry. We are not yet ready with registration for this event, but you may want to mark your calendar and reserve the dates.

There will be a **Continuing Education Institute** for clergy as well as a **Lay Education Institute** just prior to the Conference Annual Meeting (May 17 – 18) in Poughkeepsie this year. The keynote speaker for Conference Annual Meeting, by the way, is Rev. John C. Dorhauer, General Minister and President of the UCC!

When you schedule your **Boundary Awareness Training**, you should only be using trainers who have taken the "Train the Trainers" class with Penny Cannon. The Conference has 11 Certified Boundary Awareness Trainers at the moment; your Commission on Ministry liaison has the list. Anyone who is interested in becoming a Certified Boundary Awareness Trainer can take a class offered on Wednesday, June 5, in Syracuse, right after the Consultation is over.

The **Lay Preaching Course** will be offered by NYSOM starting in the fall of 2020.

The new Manual on Ministry is phasing out **Licensed Ministers** and implementing Lay Ministerial Standing. This needs to be a conversation your Committee on Ministry should have, with the assistance of Conference Staff.

NY Sexual Harassment Policy

Beginning in October of 2018, employers were required to have in place a sexual harassment prevention policy. You can find out more about this policy on the New York State website and even use the template they provide.

In addition, all employees must complete the model training or a comparable training that meets the minimum standards by Oct. 9, 2019. To help churches meet this requirement, the PRC will be offering scheduled interactive webinars starting sometime this spring.


