Playing Catch

“Want to play catch?” I *thought* that was what she said, but we were online in Zoom, so I asked her to repeat it. “Play catch, yes,” that’s what she said. “Here—” she pretended to form a ball in her hands. “Now,” she said, “you have to catch it.” And she threw it to me with a throw/push motion. I caught it and pretended to hold it. Now, she said, I had to change its shape. So, I stretched it out to something like a short fat javelin and then, at her instruction named another person in the Zoom meeting and threw it to them. I felt slightly uncomfortable throwing a javelin at them, but I had not *said* it was a javelin, and a pretend javelin could do no harm. They caught it, reshaped into a very small ball, and tossed it to another person in the group who reshaped it to something large and tossed it two-handed to another person. “See,” she said, “connection, community. Now we’re in the same space together.” She was right. The effect was remarkable. We were all in the game now, present and connected to one another in a more real way. Maybe we could toss ideas like that too.... Or, in similar fashion, could I hand the Body of Christ to an online worshiper during Communion?

Is it possible to create a meaningful sense of community and connection online? Can people enter into a worship space virtually and be more than mere observers watching television? Can we teach and learn—*really* teach, *really* learn—in an online environment? Bible study? Youth group? Can people open themselves online to the kind of vulnerable honesty necessary for real relationships and real insights, perhaps even revelation?

The ball-creator-tosser in the above scenario was Courtney Goto. In her book, *The Grace of Playing*, she coins the term “revelatory experiencing” to describe meaning-filled moments in which we lose ourselves and experience the divine depths of existence. It is a form of wondrous play, she suggests, that enables these moments—like the way children get lost in play or great musicians lose themselves and become the music. The Zoom meeting was part of an online seminary course I was teaching. She was there (“in” our Zoom room via her computer in California) to help us think about possibilities of Christian formation and transformation in the emergent cyberworld in which we increasingly live.

How do we “do church” and nurture others in faith (and live and play and work) in a hybrid world that is partly materially embodied and partly cyber-virtual?

Did you know there are online platforms to create Bible study games? You upload the content; the software makes it into a quest game. There are also free, easy to use programs for real-time interactive engagement via smart phones, for use within other online environments such as Zoom. With other software you could take a field trip to the Holy Land or tour a cathedral. I don’t personally know how to use any of these yet. These are just examples of things I learned from my students, part of the new world in which emerging new pastors live and will do church.

One of my students in their late 30s attends a weeknight Bible study at a church in Minnesota and has worshipped with them most Sundays for two years, yet she’s never been to Minnesota. Another told me I should really get a VR headset, which would open richer online experiences for “gathering” with others (and would enable me to “walk around” and explore during that cathedral tour). I’m thinking about it.

In the meantime, I’m looking forward to playing catch with my granddaughter in Georgia during our next FaceTime session.



WNYACIC Mission Work Update

Welcoming & Supporting a Refugee Family

A group of volunteers from the WNYACIC along with folks from Journey's End Refugee Services (JERS) settled the Ahmed family into their home at the end of April. Our Area churches have committed to the Community Sponsorship program through JERS. (For more details on what this entails, click [here](#).)

The Ahmed's are assimilating well to the area and the culture. We were surprised to find that the family had been living in a hotel on Genesee Street for three months prior to resettling them. The lack of affordable housing in Buffalo created this dilemma. So...seven family members, Mom, Dad and 5 children ranging in age from 6 – 18, lived in two hotel rooms sponsored by Church World Services (CWS) until housing became available.

The past two months have been a flurry of activity that required our help and support. Although the children have a good handle on the English language, Mom and Dad have been taking classes to master the language enough to be able to seek employment. There has been a flurry of appointments...doctors, dentists, DMV, etc. The children are registered for school in the Fall and are eager to start in their new schools.

Some of you have asked about the background of the family. Many refugees have experienced trauma in their home countries. Unless they provide us with information, we are encouraged not to ask directly. We do know that the Ahmed family left West Sudan when they were able. They lived in Jordan prior to coming to the United States. They are a grateful and gracious family. We are blessed in our partnership.

NY/HELP report about our Honduran nurse-practitioner, 6/21/2022

Our NY/HELP group received a message from Dr. Lito Gutierrez, our medical advisor, about a patient our Honduran nurse practitioner had seen. Below are Dr. Lito’s words translated from the Spanish message he received:

“Last night I received this text from Licenciado Joel Mencía, the nurse practitioner that works at the Dr. Gordon Comstock Clinic in La Laguna. Basically, he is telling me about an emergency in the clinic with a woman with severe emphysema and infection, and severe bronchospasm. He referred her to the Yoro hospital. Our nurse, Mirtila tells me that he took her in his own motorcycle down to La Habana and she continued from there to the hospital by bus. He also gave her some \$\$ because she had none. She is still hospitalized and “not well”. I sent this reply to him:

“Thank you, Joel! Do not forget to include the Lempiras that you gave her when you present your next request for payment. I will report to the Board your good work and dedication. I personally thank you for your demonstration of diagnostic aptitude and humanitarian charity.”

Mirtila has confirmed this report:

“I thought you should all know about this event. Joel Mencia has demonstrated, ever since he began working for us, excellent dedication, and quality of work. Please, keep this in mind for future reference. Feel free to use the story to encourage donors to contribute to NY/Help.”

As of June 13, we heard that the patient has gone home improved, and he will likely see her in his next visit to Mataderos.

We have been fortunate to be able to hire such a dedicated man as Joel Mencía to help serve the clinic. Many people would just “work their shift” but this man goes the second mile for the patients.

Our work in Honduras continues, but we are in need of funds! ♥♥♥♥

We had begun creating a new middle school and satellite clinic in one of the other villages of the tribe, Mescales in 2020. The needs of the community have surpassed a one-room clinic, and the new plans call for three rooms. With this space, the people will have access to routine medical care close to where they live. To walk to La Laguna, for either medical care or school takes about 2½ hours and is sometimes unsafe.

The cost of this new clinic is expected to be around \$9000 USD. Unfortunately, donations have dropped off considerably since the time of COVID and we don’t have enough funds to help create this important new space! As we all know, prices have increased everywhere, and medical supplies as well as building materials cost more now than they used to. Please consider helping our mission in Honduras with a gift. Good News About Our Endowment

We have some very good news to report about our endowment. We were notified in 2020 that our endowment fund had been named as one of the legatees in the will of the late Helen Khan, a faithful member of St. Stephen's Bethlehem UCC. At that time, however, we didn't know the dollar amount.

In May 2022 we received materials from the attorney representing Ms. Khan's estate, saying we would be receiving a partial disbursement of \$210,000. Our Finance Committee prayerfully considered the best way to handle the check once we received it. Due to the volatility of the financial markets this year, we decided to place half of the amount in our Balanced Funds Account with the United Church Funds and the other half in our UCF Cash and Equivalent Funds Account.

Additionally, we authorized the United Church Funds to transfer \$17,500 each month for the next six months (July through December) from our Cash Account to the Balanced Funds Account. This process is known as "dollar cost averaging," and our hope is that this will even out the volatility in the financial markets during the second half of 2022.

Ms. Khan's generous bequest has increased the value of our endowment by about 50 percent. Each January, we make a disbursement from the endowment based on the total value on the previous September 30. Ninety percent of this disbursement is divided equally among Dunkirk Camp and Conference Center, United Church Home d/b/a Plymouth Crossroads, and the Department of Community Ministries. The remaining ten percent will be determined by the Area Council and Finance Committee, with final approval at the annual meeting in November. Thanks to Ms. Khan, the January 2023 disbursement will be substantially larger than in past years.

As of June 30, 2022, we had \$34,659.04 in the American Funds (down from \$38,590.70 at the end of March); \$446,696.94 in the United Church Funds Account 009 (up from \$388,550.13 in March); and \$140,820.46 (up from \$33,393.60 in March).

The total value of our endowment accounts on June 30 was \$622,176.44, which was an increase of \$161,642.01. The \$210,000 bequest was deposited in our two United Church Funds accounts on June 15, so you can see there was quite a drop in the value of our existing investments between March 31 and June 30. We hope the third quarter of 2022 will go better, since our January 2023 disbursement will be based on the total value of our fund on September 30.



Thanks to all the churches who have so faithfully supported the wider ministry of the Western Area! It's not unusual to hit a dry patch in the heat of summer, not just a lack of rain, but also a slowdown in giving. This year the dry patch is a bit worse than previous summers, so if your church can make a donation during the summer months it will be especially appreciated. Although we are well able to cover our ongoing expenses, we are currently running a deficit of \$5,340.

In September, each church will receive a letter that will report their giving to date for 2022 as well as each church's Covenantal Share for 2023 (based on reported membership in the 2022 Yearbook). Each church will be asked to give \$8 per member to the Association. The Per Capita support to the NY Conference UCC will continue at \$2 per member.

In every season, the generous support of God's people is crucial for the ongoing ministry of the church in all its manifestations. Thank you for your faithful giving.
